## The Foundations of Restitution for Wrongs

**Hart Publishing** Restitution for wrongs, or restitutionary damages, is the judicial award which compels the wrongdoer to surrender to the victim the benefit obtained through the perpetration of the wrong, independently of any loss suffered by the victim. The establishment of a civil trial in Roman law left compensation as the main response, but there have been difficulties encountered by modern attempts to account for restitutionary damages.
